ORDER ESTABLISHING PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD
ON PETITION FOR PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE RULES
OF THE MINNESOTA BOARD OF CONTINUING LEGAL EDUCATION AND
THE RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT ON LAWYER REGISTRATION

On September 29, 2023, the Minnesota State Board of Continuing Legal Education filed a petition recommending amendments to the Rules of the Minnesota Board of Continuing Legal Education and the Rules of the Supreme Court on Lawyer Registration. The proposed amendments would place disability status lawyers on CLE voluntary restricted status at the time the lawyer elects disability status through the Lawyer Registration Office, which would make clear to such lawyers that they will not have an obligation to complete CLE requirements while on disability status. The petition and proposed amendments are available on the public-access site for the Minnesota Appellate Courts, under case number ADM09-8008 – Petition of the Minnesota State Board of Continuing Legal Education for Amendment of the Rules of the Minnesota State Board Continuing Legal Education and the Rules of the Supreme Court on Lawyer Registration (Minn. filed Sept. 29, 2023).

The court will consider the petition and proposed amendments to the Rules of the Minnesota Board of Continuing Legal Education and Rules of the Supreme Court on Lawyer Registration after providing a period for public comment and reviewing any comments on the proposed amendments.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that any person or organization that wants to provide

comments in support of or in opposition to the proposed amendments to the Rules of the

Minnesota Board of Continuing Legal Education and Rules of the Supreme Court on

Lawyer Registration shall file those comments with the Clerk of the Appellate Courts, using

the appellate courts' e-filing application, E-MACS, if required to do so. See Minn. R. Civ.

App. P. 125.01(a)(1). All comments shall be filed so as to be received by the Clerk's office

no later than January 2, 2024.
